- AWAKE. Eph. 5:14; Isa. 60:1;
- 1. "Thou that sleepeth, "the figure of our text is very expressive: In spiritual death, ithe sleeper, is not consciousness of the realt danger about him. If he knew of his danger he would not be a sleep. While he dreams of peace and safety, he is carnally secure:

Romans 13:12,13; 1 Thess. 5:4-7.

So long as the sinner sleeps in spiritual death:

1. He does no good; 2. He gets no good;
3. He cares for nothing; He is asleep.

- 2. "Thou that sleepeth." The man is asleep:
 1. He may have an abstract belief in God
 and in Christianity. So long as he is
 sleeping it matters little what he might
 have been doing had he been awake.
 - 2. His sleep is spiritual indifference. The sin of indifference prostrates all the energies of the soul. David's prayer:

 Psalms 13:3.
 - (a) Those who seemed to have been awake:

 Rom. 10:1-2: Israel's zeal was an
 element of strength. Their zeal without
 correct knowledge was their weakness.

 (b) We have all know persons as quick to
 - (b) We have all know persons as quick to cool down as they were to warm up.

 The command: Awake; Get-up; Arise.
 - From a sinful neglect of duty.
 Consider your state and danger.
 - 3. Break off your sins by repentance and obedience.
