In Luke the 16th chapter Jesus told the story of a certain rich man who was clothed in purple and fine linen and had a banquet every day. We have no reason to think that this rich man was agressively cruel. On the contrary he was so kind and merciful that when a poor ragged begger stationed himself at his gate he did not drive him away. Not only so but he allowed him to be fed with the scraps and crumbs from his own table. But this was as far as he would go.

1-He never met the begger or inquired about his needs.

Thus given only the crumbs, we are not surprised to read that the begger died.
