 - 1-In the book there is no mention of Israel. 2-There is no mention of the Tabernacle, the Temple, of the Law.
- 4-Job was perfect and upright, one that feared God, and eschewed evil.
- 5-Job was a rich man. 7000 sheep, 3000 camels, 500 yoke of oxen.
- 1-Good men are not always rich; but God had surely put a premium on the goodness and faithfulness of Job, by allowing him to become the wealthiest man in the country.
