  1. He abandoned himself to the delights and temptations of the appetite. ESau would have the savory food at all costs.
  - Christ tempted, Matthew 4:1-11.

    2. Esau was lacking in a true sense of honor and nobility. He should have maintained his position in the family, at any inconvenience to himself.

A. Other examples: Adam & Eve, Gen, 3:1-6

- 3. Esau showed a powerlessness to resist temptation. See 1 Cor. 10:12-13. Esau heard the terms proposed, insted of resisting the tempter, he yielded easily, then speaks contemptuously of his birthright, Verse 32.
- 4. Esau preferred the near and certain to the distant and probable.
