- "O Lord, thou hast searched me, and known me." Psalms 139:1.
- 1-It is in great calamities and overwhelming sorrow that we feel with peculiar vividness God's presence.
- 2-When Job was in the enjoyment of prosperity he was an eminently reverent man, but it was in the hour of his black and bitter midnight that he cried out, "The hand of God hath touched me. "Job 16:21
- 3-That same spirit is lodged deep in every breast so that God's searching comes to be associated with hours when life is shaken to its deeps, and when all the daughters of music are laid low.
- 4-The point to be noted is, that in this Psalm the writer is not thinking of such hours.

 1-There is no trace that he has suffered terribly, or been plunged into irreparable loss.
 - 2-"Thou knowest my downsitting and my uprising"
 1-My usual, ordinary, daily life. It was
 there that the Psalmist recognized the
 searching; it was there that he woke to
 see that he was known.
- 5-"Searched," the figure is, "Winnowed, or Sifted"
 1-Henry Ward Beecher said, "Before men we stand
 as opaque bee-hives. They can see the though

 inside of a man they cannot tell.
 - 2-Before God we are as glass bee-hives, and all that our thought are doing within us he perfectly sees and understands.
- 6-How near the ancient poets of India could get to the thought and feeling to this psalm is indicated in one of their songs:
 - 1-The great lord of these worlds sees as if he were near. (2)-If a man thinks he is walking by stealth, the gods know it all
