

Manifest: They are Palpable - Capable of being touched. Easily
Perceptible by the senses.
obvious to the understanding; not obscure

The works of the flesh are manifest: Manifest comes from a latin
word that means: seized by the hand.

These works of the flesh ~~are~~ as Paul listed them:

1. Adultery: Illicit sexual relationship of a married man with a
married woman other than his wife. Matt. 5:27-32; 19:3-9.
Mark 10:10-12; Luke 16:18
1 Cor. 7:10-16; Rom. 7:1-3
2. Fornication: Illicit sexual relationship between a married person
and a single persons or between single persons.
3. Unclean^{ness}: Unnatural practice...self-abuse, bestiality, and
sodomy. Rom. 1:24-27; 2 Cor. 12:21.
4. Lasciviousness: Wanton, Lewd, Lustful, Tending to produce lewd
emotions. Matthew 15:19,20; Proverbs 4:23.
5. Idolatry: The worship of idols, embracing the idolatrous feasts
and rites of different gods and goddesses. Paul says:
(a) Covetousness is idolatry. Col. 3:5. Jesus says:
(b) Ye cannot serve God and mammon. Matthew 6:24.
6. Witchcraft: Sorcery: Originally denoted the use of drugs, and some-
times their use for poisoning. As used here it
denotes the employment of the black arts in
general...magic, or claiming supernatural power.
7. Hatred: The quality which makes enemies. Hatred, ill-will. Family
feuds which lead to divorce, murder. open strife.
8. Variance: Difference, deviation; discrepancy. Dissension, discord;
a dispute; quarrel. This is seen in church trouble when
men:
(a) Take opposite sides not so much from different con-
victions...but more from personal dislike and the
disposition to thwart an opponent.
9. Emulations, or Jealousies: Painful feelings; anxious fear; un-
founded suspicions.
(a) Jealousies never allow one to "rejoice with them
that rejoice." Rom. 12:
(b) Zeal and Jealousy come from the same word and may
be used in a good sense. "For I am jealous over you
with a godly jealousy." 2 Cor. 11:2.
10. Wrath: The open eruption of anger, which, when powerless to in-
flict injury, will find vent in furious language and
menacing gestures..Under the power of wrath the individual
is completely beside himself.
11. Strife-Faction: Sometimes associated with jealousy. "For where
envying and strife is, there is confusion and every evil
work." James 3:16.

12. Seditious-Divisions: A state into which a community or church is thrown by the working of the spirit of strife. Romans 16:17

"Now I beseech you, brethren, mark them which cause divisions and offenses contrary to the doctrine which ye have learned; and avoid them."

13. Heresies-Parties: Due to self-will and devotions to opinions. My way or bust. This may be the attitude of a single member, group of members; of a single elder, or a group of elders. 1 Cor. 8:13.

14. Envyings: The rankling anger, the persistent ill will caused by party feuds. Envy is that attitude that nurses its revenge just waiting for the time to come when it shall find the opportunity to get even.

15. Murders: Murder is sometime the result of envy, hatred, and party strife. Revelation 22:14,15:

Blessed are they do his commandments, that they may have a right to the tree of life, and may enter in through the gates into the city. 15. For without are dogs, and sorcerers, and whoremongers, and murderers, and idolaters, and whosoever loveth and maketh a lie."

16. Drunkenness-Drinking: Seeking pleasure in intoxication is a remnant of savagery. A man may drink and forget his poverty, and remember his misery no more. He awakes to find that he is wretched and miserable and poor and blind and naked.

17. Revellings: Excessive and boisterous festivities of every sort and kind. Taking part in or enjoying something without restraint. Giving reins to one's inclinations, propensities, or passions. Not all Dictionaries do so but two, 20th Century Dictionary and the Oxford Dictionary of the English language, say that revelling includes dancing.

18. And Such Like: This includes not only the things enumerated, but any and everything remotely akin to the things enumerated. It is sometime contended that revelry does not include dancing. Suppose that it does not include it; SUCH LIKE certainly does.
