## Class Handout -- The Theme of Romans (Rom. 1:16,17)

- 1. The gospel versus the law is the one theme of which Paul never loses sight in the elaboration of the details of Romans.
- 2. There are five antitheses of which Paul never loses sight in developing this theme:
  - 1. When it is said that the gospel is "the power of God unto salvation," we have a hint as to the weakness of the law in reference to the great end here mentioned.
  - 2. Next, it is said that the saving power of the gospel is altogether divine it is "the power of God."
  - 3. Next comes an antithesis which points to a difference in results the gospel is the "power of God unto salvation."
  - **4.** The gospel is "the power of God unto salvation to <u>every one</u> who believes." We might infer from the very nature of the system of grace that its offer to the needy sons of men would be universal.
  - 5. In the light of these and other passages we find the <u>conditionality</u> of the gospel, as well as universality.
