- 2. Is Paul telling us in 2:1 that all judgment is wrong?
- 3. Why does Paul's argument here require an absolute standard?
- 4. Is Paul saying that the Jews were engaged in homosexuality and idolatry?
- 5. What are seven things we learn about the judgment of God in Chapter 2?
- 6. How does anyone receive eternal life "according to his deeds"?
- 7. Are we saved by faith or are we saved by works? Do our good works save us? Will anyone be saved without good works? Is there a contradiction between Paul and James?
- 8. What does the Bible have to say about salvation by "faith only"?
- 9. Does God's impartiality mean that he does not bless some people more than he does others?
- 10. We know that the Gentiles were under a law. Why? What law were the Gentiles under? How can the Gentiles be guilty of sin if they were never given any law to follow?
- 11. Are Christians under a law today? Is there a law of Christ?
- 12. Who are the "doers of the law" in verse 13 that are justified?
- 13. Paul says that Gentiles do "by nature" the things in the Law. What does "by nature" mean?
- 14. A law unto themselves? Is Paul teaching situation ethics?
- 15. Did the Jews rob temples?
- 16. How were the Jews guilty of theft and adultery?
- 17. What relation, if any, is there between circumcision under the Old Covenant and baptism under the New Covenant?
- 18. If an unbaptized person lives right, then will his "un-baptism" be counted as baptism?
- 19. Did Paul gives us a new definition of Jewishness?
- 20. Is Paul speaking only of physical Jews or is he speaking of spiritual Jews?
