- 8. How should the Corinthians live in light of the "shortened time"?
- 9. What is the reason for one's new stance toward the world?
- 10. What concerns characterize the married? The celibate?
- 11. Why does Paul point out these concerns?
- 12. Does Paul forbid marriage based upon these concerns?
- 13. Does the "virgin" in vv. 36-38 refer to a father's daughter or a fiancé's betrothed?
- 14. Must a believing widow marry a Christian?
