Ten Rules for Interpreting Apocalyptic Language

- 1. We should use easily understood verses to help us understand verses that are harder to understand.
- We should interpret apocalyptic language figuratively unless we are forced to do otherwise.
- 3. Similarity of symbol does not imply identity of subjects. (The same image can be used to depict different subjects.)
- 4. Dissimilarity of symbol does not imply distinctness of subjects. (Different images can be used to depict the same subject.)
- 5. We should always carefully study how the same symbols are used elsewhere in the Bible, while keeping Rules 3 and 4 in mind.
- 6. We should pay careful attention to the context.
- 7. We should not add symbols to the text.
- 8. We should pay careful attention to any explanations that are given in the text.
- 9. Sometimes a *literal* person, place, or thing is later used as a *figure* for a similar person, place, or thing.
- 10. Sometimes a *literal* number is also a *figurative* number.
