- 1. Jesus was raised from the dead on the first day of the week. Matt. 28:1; Mark 16:1,2; Luke 24:1; John 20:1
- 2. Jesus met with his disciples on three succeeding first days of the week after his resurrection:
 - 1. He met with Mary Magdalene near Jerusalem on Sunday, April 9. Mark 16:9; John 20:11-18
 - 2. He met with Simpn Peter alone. Luke 24:34; 1 Cor.15:5
 Sunday. April 9
 - 3. He met with two disciples going to Emmaus. Luke 24:13
 April 9
 - 4. To the epostles at Jerusalem, excepting Thomas who was absent. John 20:19. Sunday April 9.
 - 5. To the apostles the second time at Jerusalem when Thomas was present. John 20:26. Sunday, April 16.
- 3. The Holy Spirit descended on Pentecost, the first day of the week. Acts 2:1-4
- 4. The church was established on Pentecost, the first day of the week. Acts 2:41
- 5. Under apostolic teaching the disciples met together on the first day of the week to break bread. Acts 20:7
- 6. Upon the first day of the week each one is to lay by him in store as God hath propsered him. 1 Cor. 16:1.2
- 7. WE ARE NOT TO FORSAKE THE ASSEMBLY ON THAT DAY. Heb.10: 25

- 8. WHY IT IS WRONG TO FORSAKE (NEGLECT) THIS ASSEMBLY:
 - 1. We set at naught an ordinance of God.
 - (1) Meetings in that day frequent: WEEK-DAYS-SUNDAYS
 2. We deprive ourselves of SOCIAL-RELIGIOUS strength.
 - 3. We are setting a bad example before others. Heb. 4:11
 - (1) God's demands upon our time: Try us; Prove us; Search us even to the very center of our being.
